

Subject: Time pay charges

Dear Judges,

I send this email to you with the hope that you will pass it on to the appropriate person on your staff. They should work with Mr. Massanelli.

State law permits a \$10 per month fee to be charged for time pay of fines. There have been occasions when a person requests 90 days for payment, and a \$30 fee is charged up front. But, the statute states that this charge cannot be made until the time is due. So, for example, if I owed a \$100 fine, asked for three months, and paid the entire \$100 before second month, then I could only be charged \$10 for time pay. Or, same scenario, except I paid \$50 one month and \$50 the next, I could not be charged the last \$10 for time pay.

Right now the City has been sued for an illegal exaction where a person requested a certain number of months but paid the fine early. One court is working to adjust how this fee is paid. I am not sure how this impacts the other two courts, but I wanted to send this email so appropriate arrangements can be met. I am also going to conduct the Administrative Office of the Courts on this issue.
